

#### 2025 Parish of Melton Stewardship

The stewardship program is \$520 per year and is payable directly to the Parish of Melton.

<sup>\*</sup>Swimming is part of the Victorian Curriculum and each student is required to participate in the safety swim program. The Government in 2025 will provided a subsidiary of \$30 per student for the cost of the swimming program. As a result, our swimming charge has been reduced from \$75 in 2024 to \$45 in 2025.

<sup>\*</sup>Camp is held in Grade 5 and Grade 6. In recent years we have successfully applied for camp subsidies to keep the camp costs down. Subsidised camps have again been applied for in 2025 and we now wait to see if the school will be successful or not. This will be advised to parents together with the fee in 2025.

#### School Fee Concessions:

Families holding a health care card, pensioner concession card or veterans gold card need to present the card to the office each year asap to receive the concession. You will need to complete a payment plan to receive the concession. Concession applications must be in at the office by 18th June 2025. Please see the office staff if you have any questions.

Families who are of indigeous descent or hold an immicard will need to speak to the finance manager by 15th March 2025.

#### Camp Fees:

Will need to be finalised by families 2 weeks before camp attendance.

#### **Graduating Students:**

We request all fees for students graduating in 2025 to please finalised no later than 31st October 2025.

#### Bounced Payment Fee:

A bounced payment fee may apply if there are more than 4 bounced payments.

We understand this may happen at times and ask where possible to make a catchup payment.

#### Late Fee Payment:

A late fee payment may apply where fees are not paid by cut - off date.

Fees can quickly become difficult to manage. If you are having any difficulties with fees please see the school finance manager as soon as possible.

## **Birthday Lolly Bags**



If your child is a late arrival, it is expected you walk the chil/ren into the school and sign them in.

If you are experiencing difficulty arriving by 3.25pm it is also expected, you make contact with the school office to arrange alternate arrangements.







# Free Health, Wellbeing and Development Checks for Prep Students

Dear Foundation Parents/Carers.

The Primary School Nursing Program is a free service offered by the Department of Education to all prep/ foundation students and their families during their child's first year of school.

The program aims to assist in the early identification of children with potential health, wellbeing or development concerns which may impact on their education and offers screening (such as hearing, vision, speech, dental and motor skills) as well as advice, information and referrals to other health and support services.

Parents / carers can support their child's participation in the program by completing an online School Entrant Health Questionnaire.

You can access and complete the online questionnaire on a mobile phone, computer or tablet. A paper version of the questionnaire is available from your child's school if you prefer.

Once the questionnaire has been submitted, the Primary School Nurse will visit your child's school to conduct further health screenings for students that require it. The nurse may contact you to further discuss any concerns raised in the questionnaire, using the details you provided.

Soon, information about the Primary School Nursing Program, including how to access and complete the School Entrant Health Questionnaire, will be sent home. Participation in the program is not mandatory and parent/carer consent is required for the Primary School Nurse to see your child.

If you do not wish to participate, you are encouraged to register and select 'No I do not consent' in the online questionnaire so that your response is recorded.
